**Editorial - Life in an Unforgiving World**

One of the consequences of our ultra-connected world today is that we get to know about things very quickly. Sometimes this speed is good – tsunami warnings, even earthquake warnings come to mind. But too often rapidity rides with its old friend, half-truth. We think we have learned about what has happened, or is about to happen, only to find out, maybe some time later, that the situation is more complicated, or “nuanced” as the latest jargon has it.

We have long known, of course, that many accounts – most, probably – are inadequate descriptions of actual events. How often did we read the newspaper story about something we were involved in, even marginally, realising from the word go that the message wasn't quite right? These old-fashioned news media outlets, just like our more modern ones, had to condense in order

to fit the ¼ page (today's soundbite), and in doing so, they necessarily omitted some of the contextual detail.

It seems to me, however, that such inaccuracy in the news is more problematic than it used to be. Partly, the change is because today's news is not confined to a daily broadsheet or nightly news bulletin. We – the global we – respond, posting about it on Facebook, emailing it around our friends or tweeting about it. The story is amplified, especially if it is one that causes us outrage, and the rapidity of the original account is compounded. Within hours, millions around the world believe they are informed experts about the latest newsworthy triviality (for, in so many cases, sadly, the incident really is trivial in the larger scheme of things, probably not even qualifying as a nine-day wonder, let alone making it into a pub-quiz question in twelve months' time.)

Accompanying rapidity and half-truth, the third spy in this battalion of sorrows is our rush to condemn. We are outraged, pronouncing our unnuanced judgment in 280 characters or fewer. Others take up the charge, and the jury of our peers convicts. The trial has taken maybe a few hours.

But what about our Christian duty to forgive? Or the commandment to love our neighbour unconditionally? We live in a very unforgiving society, I know. The news-media trial I describe above plays out all too frequently, with some prominent person – often an entertainer or sportsperson – adjudged guilty of some horrific transgression and forever condemned (with their Wikipedia page updated to remind us, should we forget).

I am not here to defend the indefensible like some latter-day Rumpole. But I do wonder whether we should pause to consider two things. First, do we really know the full story? Second, and far more importantly, what are we wanting from our public figures? Do we expect everyone to be a saint, committing no wrong? Don't we all make mistakes? Surely, when the stars inevitably fall from grace, we should at least try to be forgiving and loving. Doing so by no means endorses their crime, assuming for the moment they are guilty. And, of course, if the case is complicated – and I

suggest it probably will be – there is an even greater need to hold back. After all, we can all acknowledge, “There but for the grace of God go I!”

**Parish Council and Church News**

The Parish Council resumed its normal monthly meetings on 17 February and agreed to approve the parish’s membership of EcoChurch.

Andrew Smith was appointed as the parish’s commissioner to the Synod of Otago and Southland’s AGM to be held in April.

An update on Government guidelines for places of worship in response to Covid was received. The parish will continue to follow official guidelines in the interests of all of our members, and will inform everyone as soon as possible if any changes to how we meet become necessary.

When Philip Somerville was appointed as Acting Parish Clerk in August 2020 and as Parish Clerk in March 2021 it was on the understanding that the situation would be reviewed a few months after Clare’s ministry with us began – he did not wish it to be a permanent position. At the February meeting, the Council recorded its appreciation of Philip’s wisdom, commitment, sensitivity, and knowledge of the parish in the Clerk’s role. Past and present Opoho members made up a good proportion of those present at John Allen’s funeral on 11 February in the Ross Chapel, Knox College (John was a former resident and life fellow of the College). John died on the evening of Waitangi Day, aged 92.

Graeme Munro led the well-crafted service based on instructions (couched as ‘suggestions’) from John. Maurice Andrew shared information about and memories of John since

they first met as students at Knox in 1954, and Graeme spoke about John’s ministry in several parishes. Philip Somerville and Matthew Jack were amongst the pall bearers.

As Philip said in a recent email, “[John] retired from the ministry, came to Dunedin and joined us at Opoho in 1994. He led services on occasions and took a full part in our church’s life. We’ve memories of him at every church study group over the years, coming thoroughly prepared and taking his copious notes. He would also beaver away in his unobtrusive way at working bees and share in many a considerate conversation. John’s life has been lived as a faithful servant of God, always caring, loyal and thoughtful.”
