

New Testament Reading Thoughts on John 14:1-2

(congregation says words in bold print)

Let not your heart be troubled.

Look up, see how the sky is beautiful and it stretches over you. Look around, see how you are surrounded by love. Look down, see how the earth holds you up. Look for me and find the joy and peace I offer. Your blessings are many; be thankful and rest in me.

You believe in God. Believe also in me.

Faith isn't just about the huge unknowable Lord, but is also a barefoot man who walks with you every day. Look around. The whole world is telling you who made it.

In my Father's house are many mansions.

Room for everyone! For people of all colours, all genders, all beliefs, all kinds. Room for your loved ones, and for your enemies.
